

## Using the Oakcrest Flash Drive Video

The new *Oakcrest Girls Camp* introduction video was produced in 2016 as a promotion video to be shown to potential campers and their parents at your Stake Oakcrest Kickoff Meeting. This video gives a beautiful overview of the Oakcrest experience. This document has been prepared to help you understand how to use the flash drive. **Please experiment with the flash drive before your kickoff meeting so that you will know how to make it work with your church building's equipment.**

Some TV's in your church building are equipped with a USB (flash drive) input on the side or back of the TV; however, some of these TV's will not play a video flash drive even though they have an input and recognize that a flash drive has been inserted. In this case, you can try the following options:

1. **Use a DVD player with a USB (flash drive) input.** Plug the flash drive into the USB port on the DVD player. Make sure you have an HDMI cord that will plug into the back of the DVD player and into the HDMI input on the back of the TV. Some TV's have several HDMI inputs. It doesn't matter which one you use. You will need to push the *Source* or *Input* button on the TV remote to find the right HDMI input that shows the DVD player. Once you click on the DVD player input, use the DVD remote to navigate to the flash drive, then click on the *Oakcrest Girls Camp* video.
2. **Use a computer with an HDMI port.** Put the flash drive into the USB port on a laptop computer and make sure you pull up the video on your computer screen. You will need an HDMI cord to hook the computer to one of the TV's HDMI inputs. Press the *Source* or *Input* button on the TV remote. Use the TV remote to navigate to the HDMI input that recognizes the computer. Click on this box. Make sure the computer is set up to play the Oakcrest video, then use the computer to start the video.
3. **Use a projector.** Some projectors are equipped with a USB port (flash drive input). Others will need to be hooked up to a laptop. Follow the directions in Step 2 for hook up with a computer. Projectors often come with other cords for older computers that do not have an HDMI port. You can try using these cords if you have an older laptop. Some computers require the use of a function key in order to play through the projector. Others will show up automatically once the projector recognizes them. You may need to refer to the projector's instructions for help in setting up the projector with a laptop, especially if your laptop is not recognized automatically.
4. **Use the Oakcrest website.** The video is available on the home page of the website ([oakcrestcamp.org](http://oakcrestcamp.org)). You can go directly to the website on a laptop and use the TV or projector to show it. (See Steps 2 & 3.)

Newer TV's will most likely play the flash drive without any problems. Just put the flash drive into the USB port on the back or side of the TV. Then push the *Input* or *Source* button on the remote. You should see a box that shows the flash drive. Click on that box and the *Oakcrest Girls Camp* video should pop up. You may see other files on the screen as well. Sometimes the TV sees other files on the flash drive that may pertain to the production of the video but are not the final product. Ignore these and click on the video.
